

God loves us and wants to meddle in our lives like we cannot even imagine. We need to open our hearts and thinking to His presence and blessing to be joyously surprised. This testimony starts with a conviction I felt at the beginning of last year. I have been blessed with good health, and I felt I needed to show greater appreciation for God's blessing and take better care of my body. I knew I was overweight, so I began a life change. I began exercising and changing how I eat. Initially, I started losing a pound a week. I am now down 45 pounds from where I started. In a seemingly unrelated experience, my CPAP machine which I was using to treat sleep apnea began to make strange sounds then died. My initial thought was, "Oh No!" My machine was very expensive to buy, and having a sleep study is annoying and also expensive. But then I began to have this peace and suspicion that God was up to something. Maybe God was behind the death of the machine. Being overweight is a contributing factor to sleep apnea. So my ordeal came to a head with the sleep study I had September 17th. I was told that I had no episodes all night long, and I should not expect my insurance company to pay for a CPAP machine I didn't need. Hallelujah! It always seemed like a diagnosis of sleep apnea was like getting a life sentence. Having to use the CPAP was like a ball and chain. I wished God would set me free, but it never occurred to me how God would do it. In addition, I shared with Pastor Justin about my suspicions before my test and asked him to pray in agreement with me. So God has incorporated the prayers and support of others in this walk. Now, I believe He has much more coming. We should never limit God by our "boxed in" thinking. Also, the other Sunday Jason challenged everyone to take communion and pray for healing, which I did with Erma when I got home. It was a beautiful confirmation of God's desire to heal me from having to use the CPAP.

Beef butchering "parties" on their farm, sweet corn for the whole church, hospitality in their home, taking families out to eat, helping on church work days, and then coming and fixing things that needed done on the church buildings when it was not an "official" work day. Alyce assisted at many home births in the early years of our church. Gene helped the youth fund their trips by Saturday trash pickups along the roads in Blackcreek Township. (Yes, you can pick up trash as unto the Lord, but you cannot litter as unto the Lord.) These were character building opportunities for our youth. Time and time again they freely gave of their time, finances, and talents to build and maintain this local body of Christ.

In our early years, Gene and Alyce embraced the Apostolic calling that God had on our church. They, as pillars, have made it possible for others to use their gifts and talents in building God's Church. Gene and Alyce

have never forgotten the simple words of Jesus, "That it is more blessed to give, than it is to receive." Their gifts of giving, hospitality, helps, and service were evident time and time again. When the Koch's were well into their

70's, one of the challenges some of us faced was to get to the church building on a Sunday morning before they did, especially in the winter. Gene shoveled snow on the Col. 3:23 principle. Gene and Alyce got to church e-a-r-l-y to make sure everything was in order and ready for that day's services. decades they served this church family faithfully. May this couples example always remind us, God's family is an eternal family, and faithful service to the Kingdom of God counts for eternity.
