Often times you will hear someone say they need to study to show themselves approved unto God. (2 Tim. 2:15) That is a correct statement if you're reading from a New American Standard Bible. However, when you look up the word "study" in the Greek, it is the word, spoudazo, which means, make haste, endeavor, give diligence. So really the verse reads more like, "Endeavor to be able to present yourself to God, a workman not ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of Truth." For some reason, the translators put the English word "study" in place of the other more commonly accepted translations of spoudazo. So what does this mean? You need to approach the Bible not from a standpoint of studying, but from a standpoint of meditating on the Word. No where in the Bible does it say to "study" the Bible. But over and over we are told to meditate on the Word of God and that it will make our way prosperous and successful. (Joshua 1:8) It would do you well to dig a little deeper into the meaning of meditation. The Hebrew word for meditate is, Haga. If you don't know the proper way to meditate on the Word, we teach an entire course that involves aspects of this in our Discipleship 3 course. Take the time today, to ponder, muse, imagine and declare the Word! That's meditation!
