"Return, backsliding Israel, says the Lord; I will not cause My anger to fall on you. For I am merciful, says the Lord." Jeremiah 3:12 Oh that we would comprehend the heart of God towards us. He is inviting us to this loving, kind, and caring relationship. He wants to be our Chief Shepherd. The One who looks after us in the midst of all the storms we face in life. Some people might struggle with the idea that a Supreme Being would be loving and caring. Maybe you have had

relationships in your life that have caused you to mistrust authority figures or despise your parents' instruction. If that is the case, I want you to know that our God is not that way. When Jesus stepped on the scene, He displayed the heart of God to

humanity. He wasn't vengeful or hateful. He showed and demonstrated the tender mercies of God. In His disciples' real-life accounts, they recorded how He was always willing to show mercy and compassion to the people who called out for it. (Matthew 9:27, 15:22, 17:15) If Jesus was willing to show mercy and compassion while He walked on this earth, what makes you think He is not willing to do so now in your life? Are you a special case? Are you the exception to the rule? No! God defines mercy in this way, not giving you what you deserve and treating you better than you deserve. When you mess up, you fall short of the standard, which we all do, myself included. God isn't

waiting in Heaven ready to pounce on you like a lion on prey. He's so willing and ready to forgive you! (Ps 86:5) Get this settled in your heart and mind right now. God desires to show mercy! (Micah 7:8) That a loving God, who cares for you, delights in treating you better than you deserve. Tell yourself this, "God loves me and He wants to show me mercy right now!" Whether you're in sin or whether you're doing really good. It doesn't matter, embrace His mercy! Often

> we think in terms of how well our performance has been and according to our performance that is how God is going to treat us. For example, we think, if I have been reading my Bible each day, then God is probably happy with me. So going to church

should be easy this week because my performance has been good. But let's say you sinned Thursday and now you are struggling with the thought of gathering together with believers on Sunday because your performance isn't up to par. Do you think God is mad at you now because your performance is bad? Which of these two are more powerful, your sin or His mercy? Stop letting your performance dictate how you relate to God. He loves you, He delights in treating you better than you deserve(mercy). Your sin and your poor performance aren't greater than God. He can overcome all that if you allow Him to work and operate in your life. (Hebrews
