

HALL OF FAME HONORS

Every once in a while it is a good thing to share life accomplishments of the members of our church. On October 13, Larry Gruber was inducted into the St. Marys Memorial High School Alumni Foundation "Hall of Fame." Coach Gruber began teaching at Saint Marys in 1970. In 1971, he helped organize and create the wrestling program. Since then he has been a part of all 52 seasons of the Roughrider wrestling program. I had the honor of coaching on staff with him for 11 of those years. "Grube" was and still remains a great friend and mentor after all these years, even though we now get to coach against one another as we have done for the past decade!

Over all those years Grube has claimed 5 league titles (including the past 4 years), and has coached 25 different wrestlers at the State Tournament. On top of that, he taught various science classes at Memorial High School for over four decades before retiring as a teacher.

If you want to see Coach Gruber in action, we actually go

head-to-head the first meet of the season on December 7 in St. Marys. You might actually hear him yell, "Get your head off the mat!" to one of his wrestlers! It's a real treat :-) Congrats, my friend! An honor well deserved!

1 Samuel 2:30 "For those who honor Me I will honor and those who despise Me shall be lightly esteemed." God takes the issue of honor very serious.
