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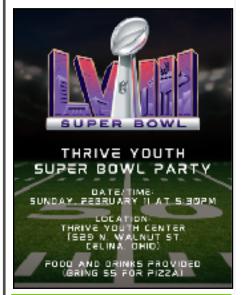
GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP February 8, 22

DISAPPOINTMENT

Get up

and

Lord

At the hearing of the news of the loss of his son, scripture records that David did the following:

2 Samual 12:20, "Then David got up from the floor, washed himself, put lotions on, and changed his clothes. Then he went into the Lord's house to worship. After that, he went home and asked for something to eat."

The first thing David

did was he got up and got moving. Disappointment has a way of paralyzing us and causing us to get indifferent to life. One of the first **praise the** ways of overcoming this is just to get up and keep

moving forward. In these early stages, the next thing we do is **wash ourselves** with the water of the Word of God. We need to remind ourselves of the goodness and faithfulness of God "throughout" our entire life. Often, the moment's pain can keep us from remembering how faithful God has been to us. Next, we need to **anoint ourselves**. We do that by abiding in Christ and allowing the Holy Spirit to have full access to our life. David

proceeds to then change his clothes. Romans 13:14 tells us to "put on" Christ. We can't let our pain keep us in the past. Putting on Christ is what enables us to walk in newness of life. David then goes to the house of the Lord to worship! Praising the Lord in the midst of the trial is one of the most powerful ways of overcoming your disappointment.

Following these steps

helps us regain clarity and focus. We can now process the pain of disappointment through a new lens of re-ordered expectations. These new, re-ordered expectations, can

give us a clearer picture of our future with the Lord. It helps us remember that life is always worth living, and that all pain endures but for a moment. By the grace of **God**, we can and will be able to continue with the life He has given us.

Joshua 1:9 "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and of good courage; do not be afraid, nor be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."
