


KID'S KORNER

GRACE BURSTING FORTH

In Matthew, chapter 20, Jesus tells this story: "The Kingdom of heaven is like a landowner that went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard. When they had agreed on a price, he then sent them out to work. After that the owner went out about the 3rd hour and saw others standing about idle and hired them, saying what ever is right I will give you. So, they went. Again,

he went out about the 6th and the 9th hour and did the same. And about the 11th hour he went out and found others standing idle, and said to them, 'Why have you been standing here idle all day?' They said to him, 'because no one bired us.' He said

hired us.' He said to them, 'You also go and work in my vineyard, and whatever is right I will give to you.' So, when evening had come, the owner told the manager to call the workers in and give them their wages." Everyone was content until those who worked in the blazing sun all day long were paid the same wage of those who barely worked an hour and hadn't even worked up a sweat! What employer would do such a thing? This boss was

not fair, they complained! God wants us to learn something about grace, something about our Father. This story Jesus shared makes no economic sense, and that's His point. Grace is not about and can't be calculated like wages! Grace is not about counting; Grace is received as a Gift! It's not toiling to earn, it's receiving. This employer didn't cheat the full day workers, they got what

was promised. Their discontent arose from the generosity of grace! Most Christians identify with the workers who put in a full days work, rather than the ones who came in at the last hour. If we are not careful, we will miss the

point. God gives gifts, not wages! Not one of us gets paid according to merit, and none of us come close to satisfying God's requirements for a perfect life. If we were paid according to our own worthiness, we would all end up in hell! In a world of ungrace, men say some deserve more than others, but in the realm of grace, the word 'deserve' does not even exist.
