

SELF-POLICING MATTERS

From time to time we like to make some announcements to the congregation that help us to keep things tidy and to do things decently and in order. Here's a quick preview of a couple of those items that we ask you to help police yourself and/or your family on:

1 - Punctuality to services:

Believe me when I say that I know it is hard to get the family out the door and be on time to church services. We are not

saying this in order to call anyone out specifically, but rather to let you know how it impacts others. When people arrive late, it causes our service team and deacons to try to find them available seats,

and in doing so, we disrupt people in the midst of them worshipping. Please consider that and make every effort to be a few minutes early for each service for this sake. I always remind people lovingly that we would never show up to our job late consistently...and doesn't the Lord deserve more honor than our boss or employer? Just a stinging thought that I myself had to receive at one time.

2 - <u>Back row seats</u>:

the elders have instructed the deacons and service team to push the back row of seats in until a) seats are needed because of large attendance or b) to seat late-comers at the beginning of the service as to not disrupt those already engaged in worship. Please let them be the ones that pull out these seats as they already are aware of available seats open.

3 - Flags and Banners:

We have a team of organized worshippers that meet/ practice weekly to lead in this art of pageantry. For all others not on

this team, we do make flags available for you to worship as well but ask that you do so either in the back of the sanctuary or outside of the pillars as to not interfere with the choreography of the

Worshiping Hearts team. If children are using flags, parents need to be present and attend to them and train them HOW to worship properly. On occasion kids will use flags to "sword fight" or whack one another and we certainly expect parents to intervene at such times so the elders don't have to.

Thanks for honoring our protocols on these things as we endeavor to do things decently and in order as to not disrupt the worship of others, as well as to maintain a spirit of excellence!
